Bryn Derwen is a small EMI residential home in the historic city of St Asaph who specialise in caring for the elderly who have dementia. We are located in a quiet residential part of the city but are very close to all of the shops, post office and cathedral, and as such are very much part of the local community. We are registered with the Care Standards Inspectorate for Wales and we provide 24 hour care for 19 male and female long term care clients, as well as also providing care for our respite and day care service users. All of our bedrooms are spacious and have en-suite facilities.

The resident's in Bryn Derwen receive professional care delivered with respect in a friendly, homely and compassionate environment, where quality of life is imperative. Our dementia care is provided by well trained and dedicated teams in an environment personally adapted to each resident's needs, all of whom receive a care plan which reflects their individual needs, interests, and physical and emotional abilities.

Activities

At Bryn Derwen we have a wide variety of activities as we believe that they are essential to a person's wellbeing as they give purpose and enjoyment to their day thus helps to improve their quality of life.

We enjoy music therapy sessions, arts and crafts, gardening, baking, memory exercises, armchair exercises, dancing, sing a longs, quizzes, bingo, card games, board games, pampering sessions, multi-sensory activities and pet therapy.



As well as all this, Bryn Derwen also provides entertainers on a fortnightly basis and our residents thoroughly enjoy the performances from Tony Hudson, Gavin Strong, Christopher Dean, and John Broadhead.

We are also able to offer our residents the opportunity for day trips out to see the countryside and local attractions and so are regularly able to visit places like Llandudno, Rhyl, Conway, and Rhos on Sea.



Over the last couple of months we have spent a lot of time visiting our friends in the local community and also our friends from one of our sister homes. As well as enjoying coffee mornings at St Asaph Cathedral, Llanelwy Community Church and Bronafallen Care Home, we also partake in many other social gatherings such as the 'Speak Up' Project, 'Singing for the Brain', and the 'Trefeirian Social Group'.

Our friends in the community

We have excellent relationships with our friends in the community and they regularly support the activity programme, themed parties, and charity events that we organise.

We regularly attend 'Singing for the Brain', 'Trefeirian Social Group', as well as 'Llanelwy Community Group' where we have been making new friends over tea and cake, and sharing our skills and experience in the activities on offer.

We continue to work with Theresa Redfern Jones who works on behalf of Age Concerns 'Speak Up' project. The 'Speak Up' project aims to encourage residents to talk about themselves and express their thoughts and feelings on things that they enjoy, would like to

do, or would like to change. Relatives are encouraged to attend these sessions if they wish. The sessions are held each Thursday at 10.30-12.00 in the main lounge.

Over the last year and a half we have spent a lot of time working with St Asaph Cathedral and so we were all sad to hear that our two wonderful Reverend's would be leaving. We presented them with a bouquet and had a lovely tea and a cake goodbye party. We would like to take this opportunity to thank the Reverent Val and Reverent Elaine for all the wonderful Church Services that they have held for us and we wish them well as they relocate to new parishes. Our Church Services will continue to be held on the first Thursday of every month in the main lounge @ 13.30 and all are welcome to join.



We are still working towards offering our residents the opportunity to have skype chats with the residents from our sister homes at Phoenix House and Bronafallen Care home. We have been taking opportunities to spend quality time at Bronafallen and we have enjoyed making new friends and pampering their cat Poppy.
