Bryn Derwen is a small EMI residential home in the historic city of St Asaph who specialise in caring for the elderly who have dementia. We are located in a quiet residential part of the city but are very close to all of the shops, post office and cathedral, and as such are very much part of the local community. We are registered with the Care Standards Inspectorate for Wales and we provide 24 hour care for 19 male and female long term care clients, as well as also providing care for our respite and day care service users. All of our bedrooms are spacious and have en-suite facilities.

The resident's in Bryn Derwen receive professional care delivered with respect in a friendly, homely and compassionate environment, where quality of life is imperative. Our dementia care is provided by well trained and dedicated teams in an environment personally adapted to each resident's needs, all of whom receive a care plan which reflects their individual needs, interests, and physical and emotional abilities.

Activities



We have a wide variety of activities here at Bryn Derwen as we believe that they are essential to a person's wellbeing as they give purpose and enjoyment to their day and so help to improve their quality of life.



We enjoy music therapy sessions, arts and crafts, gardening, baking, memory exercises, armchair exercises, dancing, sing a longs, quizzes, bingo, card games, board games, pampering sessions, beetle drives, multi-sensory activities and pet therapy.



As well as all this, Bryn Derwen also provides entertainers on a fortnightly basis and our residents thoroughly enjoy the performances from Tony Hudson, Gavin Strong, Christopher Dean, and John Broadhead.

We are also able to offer our residents the opportunity for day trips out to see the countryside and local attractions and so are regularly able to visit places like Llandudno, Rhyl, Conway, and Rhos on Sea.

Other News

Recent Developments

We are pleased to inform you that our application to cARTrefu for an artist in residency was indeed successful, and we were fortunate to have Ticky Lowe come and work with us.



Ticky is a visual artist who makes multi-sensory work and approaches to art that encourages engagement and participation. During her first session she introduced herself to everyone and after seeing how fond the residents are of our pampered pooch Henry, she decided that our project would focus on creating a Fantastical Bryn Derwen Pet!



During the next several sessions, Ticky consulted with the residents on what kind of animals they had kept in the past, what animals are like in their imaginations, and she brought in many textiles and interactive props for us to experiment with.



Her relaxed and unconventional approach to art resulted in our residents enjoying activities such as feather dancing, music dancing drawings, felt making and even several knitting sessions. The project was so popular that even our residents who usually dislike art, and indeed, several relatives themselves also took part and enjoyed themselves!



At the end of her residency, Ticky brought in our finished pet who has since become a huge hit in the home. We named him 'Shep' and he has already been on several sleepovers and adventures in our garden and even accompanied us on some of our day trips out! Shep has become so popular here that we have decided to make him some furry friends in our arts & crafts sessions in order to create a fantastical Bryn Derwen petting zoo!

We are also pleased to announce that our home has been offered the opportunity to partake in Age Connects' 'Voyager' project! This, along with their 'Speak Up' Project will be held in the next few months, and Age Connects will also be coming in to help us achieve Dementia Friends status. After becoming a member of Bangor University's Dementia Supportive Practice Community we have been busy working on some new dementia friendly signage as endorsed by DEEP in order to better aid our residents when using the bathrooms, as well as beginning to produce a visual menu catalogue so that residents can make informed choices as to what meals and drinks that they would like. We also made many new links to our home, and Helen Bradley from Conway Council's Museum Service recently paid us a visit to see our fantastic dementia friendly garden as well as giving us access to the new memory boxes that her department is currently working on once they are completed.

We have also signed up to a new research project called 'Book of You' which is a dementia friendly app that residents can use and rate their enjoyment of. Despite only being a pilot app at the moment, it is hoped that this project will be rolled out universally, during which time, staff here at Bryn Derwen will assist all those who wish to take part in creating their own digital books. In the meantime however, the Manager is offering all of our residents the opportunity to have their own 20 page photobook printed free of charge and we have already spent time going through our vast photo albums in order to find our favourite pictures.

We have also been invited to design some table centre pieces for the British Society of Gerontology's 2017 Annual conference at Swansea University! Needless to say, we are all really looking forward to getting creative with this project in our arts & crafts sessions, and we have already come up with several designs already!

As mentioned in our last newsletter, the Activities Department has recently been researching into the benefits of the Montessori Methods in treating dementia, and has so far produced some products and activities around this approach. As well as enjoying using our new activity stations and organising our sorting boxes, cleaning our brass collection, and performing light household cleaning chores, residents have responded very positively to doll therapy and food preparation too. The Manager will be dedicating a section of the corridors to a job area where residents who wish to partake in these activities can choose a chore from our jobs board. Many research papers have recently been published highlighting the benefits of this approach in care homes as it empowers residents by making them feel useful and valued. Our Manager has also recently handed out to those who have taken part a 'wage packet'; each having their names on it and filled with a selection of sweets. This has proven extremely popular, with one resident stating that 'it made my day'.



Bryn Derwen is so passionate about person centred care that we are now offering evening activities as well which are being led by our Carers and which utilise their skills, hobbies and interests. Not only does this help to keep the Activities Programme fresh, but it also enables our Carers and residents to have even more quality time together. The Activities Coordinators from all of the sister homes all now attend monthly meetings and are currently

working on ways to continue to build links between the homes. One way that this will be achieved is by hosting some competitions, and we currently have a Guy Fawkes scarecrow competition planned for November, along with a valentine's cake baking competition for February. We will also be meeting up for a sing-along during our Christmas celebrations, and will be supporting each other at our Macmillan Coffee Mornings.

Since our last newsletter we have held two residents meetings and if anyone would like a copy of the minutes then they can request these from Helen Johnson (Activities Coordinator). Everyone is welcome to attend these meetings which are held on the last Tuesday of every month to express their thoughts, ideas and suggestions.

Renovations

As part of the ongoing improvements to our home, many of you may have noticed that we have begun working towards concreting our front garden in order to make it more accessible for wheelchairs and to provide additional car park spaces. We apologise for any inconvenience that this work may cause and we are hoping to have it completed within the next couple of months.



The Dining Room has also recently undergone a new revamp and we couldn't have designed this without all of the ideas and suggestions that we received from our residents and their relatives. The new design is based on a retro themed bistro and includes a sink area and breakfast bar for our residents to help themselves too, along with new juice fountains and fresh fruit to promote hydration and healthy eating. We also plan on helping our residents to create their own individual person centred placemats in our arts & crafts sessions in order to aid conversation at mealtimes.



We continue to work on our interactive multi-sensory corridors in order to create a dementia friendly environment that is both stimulating and a source of reminiscence for our residents. We have nearly completed our Memory Lane and Seaside areas, and we will begin working on our Music, Nature and Film Corridors next. We would once again like to thank the residents and their relatives for their invaluable contributions to this project, as well as Trevor and Sparrow from Cai Dai 1950's Museum for kindly donating some vintage items to us.

Following on from some of the feedback from our recent residents meeting, we will soon begin working on transforming our small lounge into a library so that residents have a dedicated reading area to enjoy one of their favourite pastimes.
