Bryn Derwen is a small EMI residential home in the historic city of St Asaph who specialise in caring for the elderly who have dementia. We are located in a quiet residential part of the city but are very close to all of the shops, post office and cathedral, and as such are very much part of the local community. We are registered with the Care Standards Inspectorate for Wales and we provide 24 hour care for 19 male and female long term care clients, as well as also providing care for our respite and day care service users. All of our bedrooms are spacious and have en-suite facilities.

The resident's in Bryn Derwen receive professional care delivered with respect in a friendly, homely and compassionate environment, where quality of life is imperative. Our dementia care is provided by well trained and dedicated teams in an environment personally adapted to each resident's needs, all of whom receive a care plan which reflects their individual needs, interests, and physical and emotional abilities.

### Activities

We have a wide variety of activities here at Bryn Derwen as we believe that they are essential to a person's wellbeing as they give purpose and enjoyment to their day and so help to improve their quality of life.

We enjoy music therapy sessions, arts and crafts, gardening, baking, memory exercises, armchair exercises, dancing, sing a longs, quizzes, bingo, card games, board games, pampering sessions, beetle drives, multi-sensory activities and pet therapy.

As well as all this, Bryn Derwen also provides entertainers on a fortnightly basis and our residents thoroughly enjoy the performances from Tony Hudson, Gavin Strong, Christopher Dean, and John Broadhead.



We are also able to offer our residents the opportunity for day trips out to see the countryside and local attractions and so are regularly able to visit places like Llandudno, Rhyl, Conway, and Rhos on Sea. Our Driver is always taking us to fun and exciting places; recently we went to the arcades at Llandudno Pier, a picnic and fishing trip at Kinmel Bay and The River Clwyd at Llandyrnog, as well as Flint, Denbigh and Rhuddlan Park for our photography based activity sessions.





We spend a lot of time visiting and working alongside our friends in the local community. As well as enjoying coffee mornings at St Asaph Cathedral, Llanelwy Community Church and Jacobs Ladder, we also partake in many other social gatherings such as the 'Speak Up' Project, 'Singing for the Brain', and the 'Trefeirian Social Group'.

As reminiscing forms an important part of our activity programme we have continued to produce short videos documenting important events from Bryn Derwen. These short films not only help to preserve memories for our residents and staff, but they also allow for friends and relatives to share in these happy moments too. ### **Our friends in the community**

We have excellent relationships with our friends in the community and they regularly support the activity programme, themed parties, and charity events that we run.

As well as attending 'Singing for the Brain' and the 'Trefeirian Social Group', we also regularly attend the 'Llanelwy Community Church Group' where we have been making friends over tea and cake, and sharing our skills and experience in the activities on offer. The newest minister, Pastor Simon, has visited our home on several occasions since being appointed to St Asaph and he has been a hugely popular visitor with our residents.



Age Connects continue to work alongside our Activities Department in delivering their 'Speak Up' project led by volunteer Theresa Redfern Jones. Relatives are encouraged to attend these sessions if they wish, which are held fortnightly on Thursdays at 10.30-12.00 in the main lounge.

Other regular visitors to our home include various Lay workers from St Asaph Cathedral. Our Church Services are held on the first Tuesday of every month in the main lounge @ 13.30 and all are welcome to join.

We make every effort to visit our friends from our sister homes; recently we were kindly invited to visit Bronafallen in Corwen as part of Senior Health & Fitness Day. It was during this time that we started up a bowling tournament which was later continued on our trip to Phoenix House in Sandycroft. We all really enjoyed taking part in this friendly competition

and despite some blatant cheating from Team Phoenix House; I am pleased to inform you that Team Bryn Derwen won the tournament and were crowned champions.



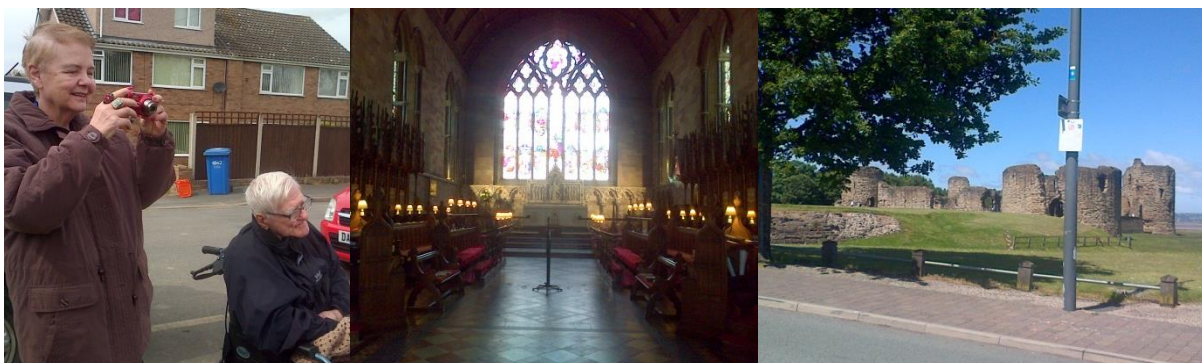

### **Celebrations**

Over the last few months here at Bryn Derwen we have set up a variety of entertainment and activities to celebrate important events in the calendar. Here is a list of all the themed events that we have participated in.

### **Photo Month**

As part of this activity we visited a variety of locations in order to capture and edit photographs concerned with themes such as Nature, Portrait, Landscape, Object and Abstract. After receiving a quick tutorial, our residents spent several afternoons taking their own pictures; a small selection of which are displayed here for you to enjoy.

### **Nature Photography Day**



As part of 'Nature Photography Day' and our ongoing 'Photo Month', we spent the morning going on walks around St Asaph's beauty spots to photograph the local wildlife. After dinner a group of us visited Ruthin Park where we took pictures of ducks, swans, cows and flowers before making a quick visit to the local playground.



### Ladies Day

We all had our posh clothes and betting slips at the ready as we held a ladies day event to tie in with this years Investec Derby. All bets were placed a few days prior to the big day; the morning of which saw us all get dolled up to the nines during Beck Marriot’s popular pamper and fashion sessions. After designing our own jockey shirts during our arts and crafts group, we then had a quiz to test our knowledge on famous horse races.



After dinner we watched the race together over a posh tea party which consisted of lots of wine, cheese and crackers. Sweets and chocolates were provided for those with the winning bets, and after having our pictures taken, we ended the day watching the film ‘The Horse Whisperer’ together.



### Grand Opening of our garden

As you know Bryn Derwen is committed to looking after people with dementia and we are constantly striving to improve and enhance our home living environment in order to provide appropriate person centred daily experiences to all our service users, staff and visitors. The

purpose of these renovations was to transform our uninspiring garden into a place that enriches the lives of those with dementia, thereby putting person-centred care into real practice and helping to turn the care home into a place to live, not just exist

We introduced a number of simple and effective changes to our garden as it's the little things that make a big difference to the quality of care provision. Soft outcomes (things you can't measure) help in giving people back their dignity and so we set about creating a garden that promoted inclusion and encouraged interaction. Our newly designed garden facilitates movement by having wheelchair friendly paths and features multi-sensory items such as light-up water features, a memory garden, an enchanting mural, wind chimes, tweeting bird garden ornaments, hanging baskets, raised planters, individually decorated plant pots and a special beach themed area that promotes reminiscing about childhood holidays and days out at the seaside. We also have a canopy which allows the garden to be used in all weather conditions, thus maximising its potential as a useful resource.

We used scented plants, flowers and vegetables to add to the sensory qualities of our garden as they facilitate colour, memory, texture, smell and taste. Many of you along with our friends from the community donated clippings from your own gardens for us to use which enabled everyone to contribute to the project.

Investing in these physical improvements has had a very noticeable and positive effect as it has created a calm and pleasant atmosphere for both our clients and our staff. Many of the changes we have made are simple and straightforward but they have had a tremendous impact on the quality of care residents receive. Some of our residents have significant dementia care needs and although the homes practice was already good, this garden has been hugely beneficial to our residents.

Transforming our garden in this manner has enhanced their sense of freedom and given them the opportunity to experience the different seasons in the garden, as well as creating a stimulating and calm environment which facilitates movement. This allows for new outdoor/garden based activity sessions to be run and by tailoring our activity programme around the development of our garden, many of our service users have directly partaken in the planting of seeds, designing of plant pots and assisting with the painting duties on our mural (adapted to their abilities via the use of stencils which enabled everyone to take part in this activity). The art work around the garden comprises of familiar and meaningful images for the residents as people with dementia can get confused in their environments, so we've made everything easily recognisable. Colour contrasts were employed as a quick and effective way of helping surroundings to stand out (e.g. different coloured flowers, furniture, benches, bird tables, etc.) and these are set against an enchanting mural which serves as a backdrop to painted fields, streams and meadows as well as local landmarks which encourage reminiscence.

Since the completion of our Sensory Garden we have been enjoying the warm weather together by participating in outdoor activities such as Football, Arts and Crafts, Gardening, building sandcastles in our beach area, and we held our own ladies day for Ascot as well as a Wimbledon themed day.





Despite the bad weather our Grand Opening on the 17th June was very successful due to the canopy and colourful parasols. As well as a lavish buffet, we were also treated to a barbeque and a selection of beverages. Our Elvis singer kept us entertained whilst we socialised and made new friends. We all had a wonderful time and we would once again like to thank everyone who came along to this event and who contributed to this project.

### International Picnic Day & Go Fishing Day
